Oracle & SAP licence health check

Many organisations have run their businesses on SAP and Oracle ERP solutions and platform technologies for years, and these solutions quickly became the backbone of their integrated platforms, often their main systems of records.

ERPs were often implemented in the late 1990s or early 2000s and are now either technically and architecturally at the end of their lives, or have a limited roadmap for future development and enhancement by the vendor. SAP are even going so far as setting end-of-support deadlines for their legacy solutions to push clients down the S/4HANA path. Both Oracle and SAP's focus is now on their respective Cloud and SaaS strategies, but this doesn't mean the support costs for their legacy solutions are reducing; in fact, quite the opposite.

Furthermore, most organisations would have customised their applications to suit their business needs and give them a competitive edge and have very limited appetite for costly and often disruptive upgrades forced by the vendors to remain supported.

Complicating matters even further, after many years of use, most organisation often have little insight into their current usage versus licence entitlement position, putting them on the back foot when negotiating a new deal with Oracle and SAP's sales and support teams and potentially facing a massive exposure if the auditors come knocking.

Organisations that don't have the desire, justified business case or near-term plans to undertake a transformation project and move their ERP and technology platforms to the vendor's new Cloud offerings, often look for a better and cost-effective model for their legacy platforms.

Moving to Rimini Street

Under ever-present pressure to reduce operational costs, CFO's; Sourcing; Procurement and Vendor management leaders are looking to realise savings by moving legacy SAP and Oracle Applications and Technology environments to Rimini Street for support.

If these are ignored and a client is audited any time in the future, it can result in a significant financial penalty.
